Hirota Glass Japanese Glass Museum

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Founded in 1897, this glass art museum shows the collections of Hirota Glass, one of the oldest glassmakers in Tokyo. In addition to the nostalgic items that have been sold since the 1930s, the exhibition features Japanese and vintage glass pieces that were collected by the Chairman, Tatsuo Hirota. Manufacturing tools like molds for molding and other technical books are also on display. Feel the connection the warmth of the glass brings to you and enjoy the craftmanship that has been passed down from generation to generation.

What is "Japanese Glass" in the collection?

Japanese Glass is a glass product created based on Japanese aesthetic beauty that expresses "calmness" and "peace and harmony." From the Edo period, when "Jappan (Japan) blowing" was the mainstream, civilization and enlightenment triggered by Meiji Restoration led to the fusion of Western glass technology and Japanese aesthetics. As a result, people started making household items using glass.
